EXAMPLES OF TRANSPORTATION CONFORMITY PRACTICES

FHWA's Transportation Conformity Website has been updated to provide users the ability to search a repository of transportation conformity examples that could be replicated in other areas of the country.

The repository currently contains examples of:

- PM_{2.5} and PM₁₀ project level hot-spot analyses
- State and local procedures for determining whether PM_{2.5} and PM₁₀ hot-spot analyses are required for a project
- State and local on-road mobile source strategies in State Implementation Plans (SIPs)
